Dr. Rima Karami-Akkary

Currently Dr. Karami-Akkary is a public and private school consultant and trainer. She has developed and conducted workshops on school based supervision targeting school administrators, and has been a member of "Team International" presenting week long seminars as in-service training for Lebanese school administrators. Dr. Karami-Akkary has a bachelors and masters degree from the American University of Beirut, Lebanon, and a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Portland State University in Oregon. She has been an in-residence lecturer at the American University of Beirut, Lebanon, and is currently working with Portland State University on course development in the area of school based supervision.

Dr. Karami-Akkary will be available as an educational leader in residence March 4th and 5th, and will be available to visit classes on both days/evenings. On Tuesday March 5th, Dr. Karami-Akkary will share her personal experiences and advice about conducting and writing thesis and doctoral work in a 2nd language.
